Three Attend Honor Band

On December 5 and 6, a small group of band students traveled to Aberdeen to attend the North Area Honor Band that was hosted by Northern State University. Usually it is held at the Johnson Fine Art Center, but since there is still construction on the building, the North Area Honor Band was held at Aberdeen Central High School.

The first day of practice started at one in the afternoon and went to about nine at night. During

Kin and arranged by Loras Schissel.

On Saturday, the day of the concert, the students started practice at eight in the morning and went to about four in the afternoon. The students had a two hour break to relax before the concert that night. The concert started around seven o'clock that night and had a short intermission for the band directors to hand out the North Area Honor Band pins. This was the third year for both Moeller and Voegele to receive that pin and it was Schweitzer's first year. Moeller and Schweitzer also received a pin, but they also received recognition for playing a solo during some of the songs that were performed.
